Dear Mrs. Hassett:

More than three years have elapsed since the cessation of hostilities of World War II, which cost the life of your brother, the late Second Lieutenant Anthony J. Goode, and it is with reluctance that I am writing at this time for I must furnish information which may bring you added sorrow.

The records of the Department of the Army disclose that your brother was a crew member aboard the B-24 Aircraft Number 42-110109, which crashed off the coast of Biak Island, Netherlands, New Guinea, on 5 May 1944, while returning from a strike mission on Mokmer Airdrome, Biak Island. The Missing Air Crew Report indicates that the plane was damaged by an enemy fighter plane soon after leaving the target. One engine began to burn and, within a few seconds, the fire spread to the trailing edge of the wing. The plane, at that time, seemed to be under control, but had slowed down. Shortly afterwards the pilot gave the bail out order; however, the wing was seen to crumple at the #2 engine and the plane dove into the water. Of the eleven men manifested aboard, only two survived.

A flotation box and life raft were dropped to the survivors, immediately, by one of the other planes in the formation, and their position was radioed to Dumbo, Hollandia, and Los Negros. Lieutenant Horn, one of the survivors, was able to reach the life raft. Shortly thereafter he sighted Flight Officer Joseph Broncato and managed to pull him aboard the raft. They then circled the area looking for other survivors; however, none were sighted. On the third day, two B-24's dropped another life raft and an emergency radio, plus additional rations. These two survivors were picked up on the fourth day by a Navy Dumbo. This plane also gave a negative report relative to other survivors.

Since the airplane went out of control when at an approximate fifteen thousand foot altitude, and the plane exploded on impact with the ocean, the chances of the other men surviving the crash are remote.

In view of the fact that the two survivors were rescued four days after the crash; that the nine missing personnel were not on either of

the life rafts; and that a thorough search of the area was made, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that the remains of these men are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional evidence come to our attention indicating that the remains of your brother are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.

Realizing the extent of your grief and anxiety, it is not easy to express condolence to you who gave your loved one under circumstances so difficult that there is no grave at which to pay homage. May the knowledge of your brother's honorable service to his country be a source of sustaining comfort to you.

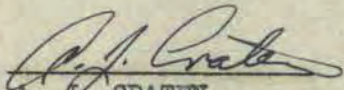

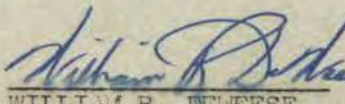

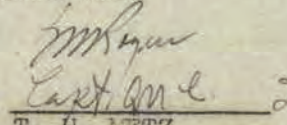

STATEMENTS

11 May 1944

At about 1148 a Zero using a split S attack hit Major Cass's ship in #2 engine and immediately that engine was feathered and within a few seconds the engine was on fire and the fire spread to the trailing edge of the wing within a few seconds. The plane at that time seemed under control but had slowed down. Shortly after the men were seen to bail out, two parachuted out of the waist window and chutes opened and two more followed but no chutes opened and they fell into the water, at an altitude of 1,700 feet, the wing was seen to crumple at the #2 engine and then the plane dove into the water. The plane hit the water at 1152. Immediately I called to the formation to fly top cover for me as I went down to circle the survivors and to give them the flotation box and life raft. Two Zeros were still above us and dropped phosphorous bombs on us while we were circling the survivors. My Navigator immediately gave the position of the survivors to the radio operator who in turn notified Dumbo, Hollandia and Los Negros. After we had done this I told the formation to get on my wing and then returned to base.

Purple 12 climb 59 6,000 feet and circled while radio operator sent position in clear on (CW). (Sent urgent message on recco. frequency 7420 kcs.) No answer. All this time pilot was calling Gardenia 10 on voice, (frequency 4475 kcs.) Emergency IFF was turned on immediately. Kept calling. No answer.

Later same message was transmitted on frequency 6775 kcs. Still received no answer. We then tried frequency 4475 kcs. on (CW), with no success.

After trying for an hour to contact ground stations on (CW), radio operator sent MO's until we left area at 1445K. Pilot was continuously trying to contact Gardenia 10 or Saloon on Frequency 4475 kcs. Also tried VHF on channel "A" occasionally.

At 1220K when strike airplanes were returning from target, we were able to contact Purple 4A on VHF. Purple 4A (Lt. Davis), relayed position report to Hollandia.

Purple 12 and 13 left area at 1445 K after dropping all emergency equipment. At this time we stopped sending MO's and turned off emergency IFF.

On route back to Hollandia, at about 1515K, we finally contacted Gardenia 10 on frequency 4475 kcs. We told them we had left search area and repeated position of survivors (1020' S- 137° 10' E).

STATEMENT

9 May 1944

On May 7, 1944, Lt. Finnell and I went on search for the survivors of Major Cass' Crew. At 0945 we reached the area to be searched. At 1145 on the last leg of our search, at 800 feet altitude, Lt. Westray, my Co-Pilot, recognized the raft thru his field glasses. It is very hard to recognize a raft and the green sea marker even with glasses. The gold dust marker was easier to see but resembled some streaks of smudge which were very common in the area.

On finding the raft with two survivors I turned on the emergency IFF and called GARDENIA on 4475 kcs on voice, but was unable to receive an answer. While I circled low, Lt. Finnell circled several thousand feet about me, keeping me in sight, for better radio transmission. My radio Operator tried to call a MOMOTE on 6775 kcs and HOLLANDIA on 4930 (which station we found not to have been in operation by May 7th), and AITAPE on 6608 and also tried 7420. Reccon Day frequency but could receive no answer, probably due to our low altitude. We contacted our group leaving BIAK on strike and arranged for one of their planes to stop in at HOLLANDIA and make certain that GARDENIA was on it's way. This plane was given the latitude and longitude of the raft. These planes kept reporting that they were unable to contact GARDENIA until approximately 1400 at which time we heard GARDENIA had been given the story, but we did not know if GARDENIA were coming. At 1430 we were getting low in gas, were unable to get any further word from GARDENIA so we dropped the men an emergency radio; a wooden case and containing water, food, sea markers etc; and an additional raft all of which they picked up.

We landed at HOLLANDIA about 1630 and learned from the tower that two Cats had gone up for the survivors. In the morning I learned both cats had negative results and that the first had arrived at the raft area at 1530. The tower attempted to reach GARDENIA at 0900 but failed.

I went to CYCLOPS strip to speak to Col Huchison, CO of the 310th Bomb Wing. He said GARDENIA had been two hours late to pick up a P-40 pilot 25 miles from HOLLANDIA on May 7th after which they had gone up to find Major Cass' survivors. I gave him full details as to the location of the raft and the emergency radio they had and also P-38 pilots who were to escort the GARDENIA that day. Major Johnson is in charge of the P-38's which are based at HOLLANDIA strip. They wanted me to go with them but I was unable on account of an engine which was running badly.

GARDENIA appeared above the field at 1145, which was the first time the tower was able to contact her. With the P-38 escort GARDENIA immediately set out to search for Major Cass' survivors.

An amphibious GARDENIA will operate from HOLLANDIA strip as soon as its nose strut is fixed, which should be by May 10th. Col. Huchison, who was very cooperative, said that he would be able to give much better service with the AMPHIBIOUS GARDENIA. Since I had done everything I could think of, I returned to MOMOTE.

1. The Commanding General, South Pacific Area, by his Shipment No. 056, reported the following personnel of the 5th Bombardment Group (H), 72nd Bombardment Squadron (H), missing in action since 5 May 1944 over Hollandia, New Guinea, while in flying pay status:

2. Missing Crew Report No. 5083 of the 72nd Bombardment Squadron, 5th Bombardment Group, indicates that subject personnel were part of the Hollandia 5 May 1944 on a strike mission. While returning from the target the No. 2 engine of subject aircraft was damaged by a "Zero" and was subsequently feathered. Within a few seconds the engines started to burn. The fire spread to the trailing edge of the wing. The plane seemed to be under control but had slowed down. Shortly afterward, the men were seen to bail out. Four men parachuted out of the waist window; two chutes opened, but two chutes failed to open causing the men to fall 1700 feet into the water. The wing then crumpled, and the plane dived into the water at 01° 17' S - 137° 13' E. A flotation box and life raft were dropped to the survivors immediately. Their position was radioed to Dumbo, Hollandia and Los Negros. The planes which had been giving aid and notification of the loss then returned to base. A search was instituted but the results were negative in relation to subject personnel. First Lieutenant Willard L. Horn, 0677635, pilot, and Flight Officer Joseph Broncato, T61825, co-pilot, were picked up by Black Cat on 8 May 1944.

AG 704 DEAD (Nov 44)

3. A statement made by Second Lieutenant Frank Bahouth, Jr. A.A.F., Assistant S-2 Officer, gives the following description of the circumstances surrounding the loss:

"Lieutenant Horn states he . . . seemed to hit the water almost immediately. He believes that his chute opened approximately at the same time he struck the water. After returning to the surface of the water, Lieutenant Horn removed his chute harness and inflated his Mae West. At this time he observed that the airplane had already hit the water and was burning; Lieutenant Horn at this time was just outside of the oil slick. He also saw several B-24s circling overhead with 2 to 3 Zekes maneuvering above them. Observed a life raft being thrown out by one of the circling B-24s. This raft was lost sight of by Lieutenant Horn and he began swimming towards a small island southwest of him. A half hour later he saw the raft ahead of him and . . . headed for the raft and reached it in fifteen minutes. The raft was not inflated. Inflation was accomplished by a CO2 bottle after which Lieutenant Horn boarded the raft. Up until this time no other survivors were sighted by Lieutenant Horn. He then stood upright in the raft . . . and saw sea marker on the surface of the water approximately 400 yards away. . . . Shortly thereafter sighted Flight Officer Broncato floating in the water. . . . Upon reaching Flight Officer Broncato, Lieutenant Horn managed to pull him aboard the raft. They then circled the area looking for others survivors; none were sighted. Their position at this time was reported as being 1 deg. 17 min S-137 deg. 23 min. E. For the three nights and four days that they were at sea they attempted to hold this position to aid rescue facilities.

". . . . On the third day two B-24s were sighted which dropped another life raft and an emergency radio plus additional rations. . . .

"On May 8th, Lieutenant Horn and Flight Officer Broncato, were picked up by a Navy Dumbo at 1537 K Approximately 30 miles southeast of the position at which they bailed out. . . ."

4. The 11th Indorsement, Headquarters, South Pacific Base Command, dated 18 October 1944, to letter AG 704 (24 Aug 44) PC-3, dated 24 August 1944, subject: Determination of Status" states: In view of the statements contained in 5th Indorsement and inclosures No. 1 and No. 2 it is logical to assume that personnel concerned could not have survived and it is recommended that personnel concerned could not have survived and it is recommended that their status be changed from "missing in action" to "killed in action" as of 5 May 1944.

AG 704 DEAD (4 Nov 44)

5. The 5th Indorsement, 72nd Bombardment Squadron (H), 5th Bombardment Group (H), dated 13 September 1944, to letter AG 704 (24 Aug 44) PC-S, dated 24 August 1944, gives the following reasons for this change of status:

"The island that was the target for this crew is now in our possession and has been for some time. We have never received any word indicating that survivors reached this island.

"The airplane went out of control when at approximately fifteen hundred feet (1500) altitude and dove into the ocean. The chances of anyone surviving this crash is negligible, particularly since the airplane blew up on the impact with the ocean.

"The two (2) survivors, 1st Lt. Willard L. Horn and Flight Officer Joseph Broncato floated in the vicinity of the downed airplane from 5th May 1944 to 8th May 1944 when they were rescued by a Black Cat. During this time these two men did not see any other survivors. The search plane that rescued Lt. Horn and F/O Broncato also gave a negative report as pertains to other survivors."

6. The facts and circumstances surrounding the disappearance of subject personnel are such as to justify acceptance of the foregoing information as an official report of death.

7. It is recommended, therefore, that casualty reports be initiated stating that the following personnel of the 5th Bombardment Group (H), 72nd Bombardment Squadron (H), Air Corps, were killed in action on 5 May 1944, when their aircraft crashed into the ocean off the coast of Biak Island, while in flying pay status

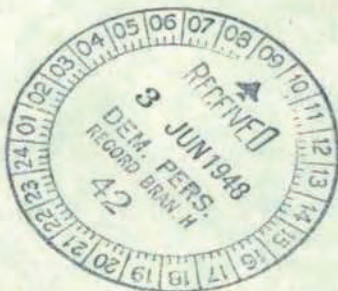

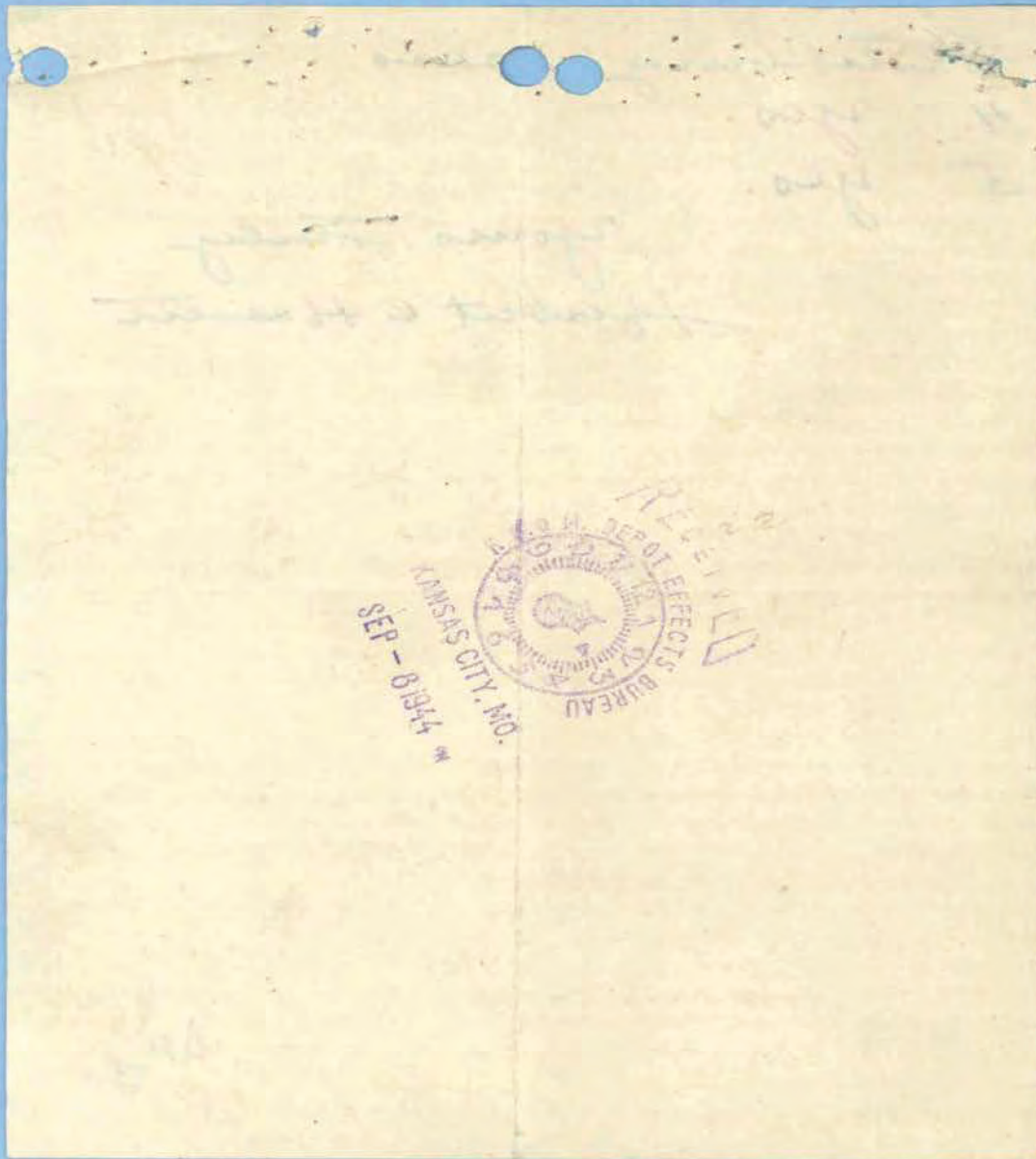
